March Fly Fishing SFC Outing Crooked River—March 7

On March 7, we will fish the Crooked River south of Prineville. You can camp at any of the several campgrounds (we will camp at Cobble Rock), stay at a motel in Prineville, or you can just make it a long day trip from home.

To get there, drive Highway 22 east to Sisters, turn left onto Highway 126 on the east edge of Sisters and follow it through Redmond to Prineville, turn right (south) at the Bowman Dam (Highway 27) sign in the middle of Prineville, and follow it about 17 miles to Cobble Rock campground.

Suggested gear is a 4-6 weight rod with floating line. There should be hatches of blue wing olives and midges in the afternoon, but most fishing will be nymphing right along the bottom with the cooler water temperatures. Nymphs include midge pupa, pheasant tails, and hare's ears, plus Euro-nymphing patterns. Dry flies and emergers include blue wing olives, midges, caddis, and PMDs. Soft hackles, like Syl's Midge, also may work. Most fly sizes should be small, often in the size 16-20 range.

Remember your wading staff, since the rocks are uneven and slippery. And, it will be cool at night!

The club will grill hamburgers for a mid-day meal on Saturday. Bring a small side dish to share, if you wish, as well as your beverage.

March 2020 Fly of the Month

Bug Eyed Hornberg

Recipe

Hook: TMC 5262, (2x long)

Thread: Black 6/0

Abdomen: Flat or oval silver tinsel

Underwing: Yellow Hackle

Overwing: Mallard Duck, natural or dyed wood duck.

Superglue

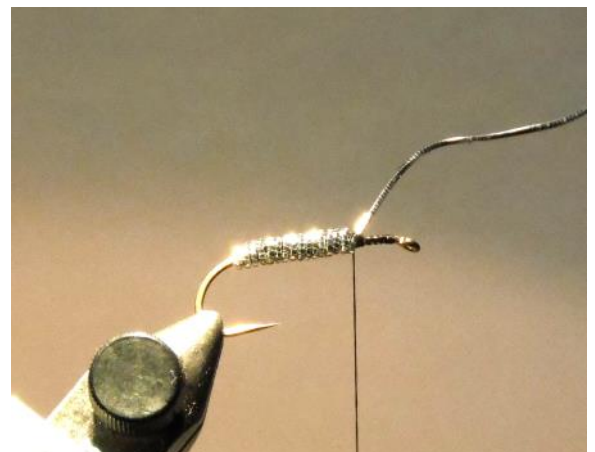
Eyes: 3/16 dia.

Glue: Loon UV thin resin.

Directions:

Debarb hook, mount in vise and tie in thread, run thread to the back of the hook.

Tie in tinsel, run thread to about $\frac{1}{4}$ shank length behind the eye, wrap tinsel forward and tie down.



Tie in a bundle of yellow hackle fibers, length should be about 1 ½ shaft lengths long.



Select two mallard duck feathers, match them together concave sides together, should be about 2 shank lengths long, strip butts and tie in, one each side of the hook. Build a thread head, whip-finish and trim off thread.

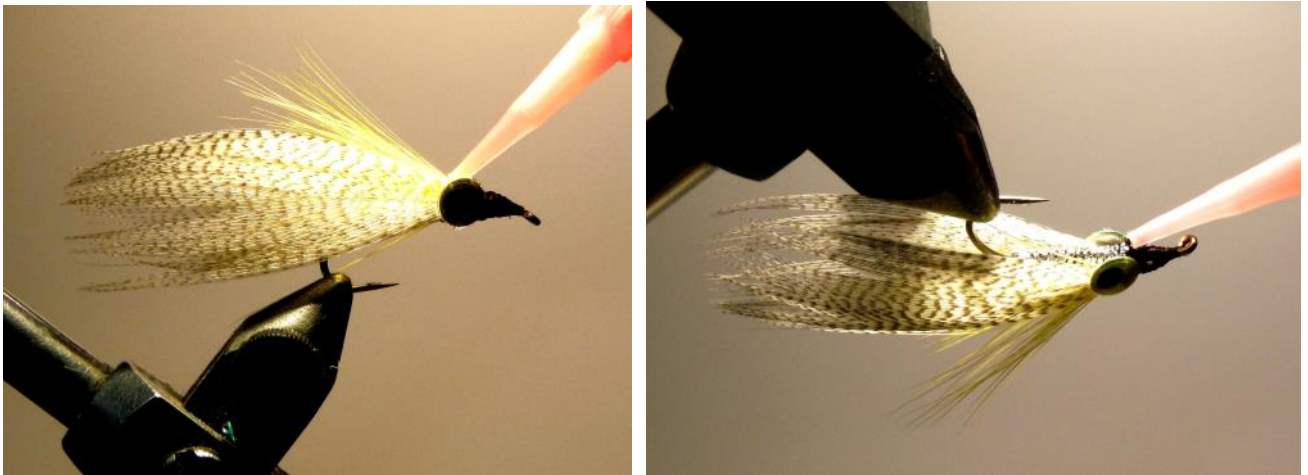


Apply a small drop of superglue at the butt of the hackles.

Apply eyes to super glue area.



Apply UV resin into the gap between the eyes and run resin forward onto thread head, set with UV light, (apply resin to both top and bottom gaps between the eyes).



Fishing Notes: This pattern is a version of the Hornberg, I don't remember what the actual name was, so I call it a Bug Eye. At one fly shop I stopped at, a fisherman came in and asked one of the guides about a small tan baitfish about 1 ½ to 2 inches long that was spit out of the mouth of a large trout he caught. He matched a Hornberg to the size, color and shape of the baitfish and proceeded to land several large trout on it. The guide stated the bait fish was a carp fry.

Fishing this fly is interesting. I use a direct line Euro rig, run the fly through the riffles and main run on a tight line, at the end of run, throw a big mend to add line, then let it swing through the tail out of the pool. Once it is hanging downstream, slowly strip it upstream working it as a streamer. Fish hit it on the drift, on the swing and being worked upstream. Landed a good number of brown trout using this fly on the East Walker River using the above methods.
